INTRODUCTION

OVERVIEW

These data provide information on the number of arrests reported to the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program each year by police agencies in Metropolitan Statistical Areas. Although not as well known as the "Crimes Known to the Police" data drawn from the Uniform Crime Report's Return A form (see ICPSR 9028), the Arrest Reports by age, sex, and race provide valuable data on 43 offenses. The arrests reported by each agency have been summarized for each of the years 1960 through 1997. Arrests are reported by age, sex and race.

STUDY DESCRIPTION

The original Uniform Crime Reports data were restructured by the principal investigator to create two separate files for each year. One of these contains a header record for each agency. The other contains detail arrest records for each agency. Because the data layout changed slightly in 1980, the data were restructured and reformatted at the University of Massachusetts, Amherst, Massachusetts in 1996 and 1997. All data sets now have the same layout, with pre- 1980 codes and codes for 1980 and beyond clearly indicated. In addition to reformatting made necessary by the 1980 change, files were simplified by separating agency header records from the detail records submitted by the agencies. For each year there is now a header file and a data file. The header files can be linked to the detail files because each contains the agency's originating agency identifier (ORI). Additional variables are common to both files. Users of the data should be aware that some police agencies listed in the header files for some years did not submit detail records.

The UCR program is voluntary on the part of police agencies across the country. On occasion, therefore, some agencies may not report arrest data. In most cases small breaks in the data for one offense for one agency for one year can be mended by interpolation. In other cases, missing data may be so extensive that the agency must be dropped from the analysis. Since some agencies fail to report arrest data for one or more months in the year, the indication of the months for which data were submitted is useful when it is provided in the header record for a police agency.

DATA COLLECTION PROCEDURES

The data for the Uniform Crime Reports are submitted voluntarily by city, county, and state law enforcement agencies. Some agencies receive forms directly from the FBI and return them directly to the FBI. Many others receive forms from state collecting programs and return the reports to those programs. The state programs, in turn, forward the reports to the FBI. Reports are sent out and collected on a monthly basis.

Once received, the FBI checks the agencies' reports for completeness and arithmetical accuracy. If an unusual fluctuation is detected in an agency's crime count, the FBI compares those counts with counts from previous reports or compares the frequencies to those of agencies similar to the agency in

question. When necessary, law enforcement agencies are contacted to correct or explain the figures.

Starting in 1974, the age, sex, and race data were provided monthly to the FBI by local law enforcement agencies participating in the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting program. These monthly data were summarized by the UCR Section to produce yearly arrest totals for each agency. Prior to 1974, local police agencies submitted annual, rather than monthly, summary reports of arrests by age, sex and race. Data for 1960-1972 were given to the principal investigator in 1976. Additional data sets for specific years were provided over the following 19 years. In 1996, through a cooperative arrangement of the Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research, the Bureau of Justice Statistics, and the Federal Bureau of Investigation, data were provided for the following years: 1973, 1977, 1979, 1981-1984, 1986-1989, 1991-1992, and 1994.

FILE STRUCTURE

The Data for the UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM [UNITED STATES]: ARRESTS BY AGE, SEX, AND RACE FOR POLICE AGENCIES IN METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREAS, 1960-1997 are contained in 76 raw data files. Each year has a header file and a detail file. The header files contain information specific to the reporting agencies. Header files all have the same layout and have a logical record length of 75. The header files contain 18 variables and range in record count from 1,664 to 8,959. The detail files contain arrest information by age, sex, and race. Detail files also have the same layout and have a logical record length of 384. The detail files contain 71 variables and range in record count from 20,560 to 142,820.

Data files, machine-readable documentation, and SAS and SPSS data definition statements have been prepared for this collection. Since minor changes to the coding of variables adjustment (ADJ) and group (GRP) occurred in 1980, data definition statements for the periods 1960-1979 and 1980-1997 are provided.

RECORD CONTENTS

Each record in the header files contains information on one police agency. Information such as geographic area, population covered, and agency name is listed on each record for the particular agency. Consequently a record corresponds to an agency.

The meaning of a record in the detail files is more complicated. A record in a detail file corresponds to arrests per agency-offense. For example, if an agency reports arrests for three separate offenses, murder, rape, and robbery, there will be three records in the detail file for that agency. The first record will list arrests for murder. The second record will list arrests for rape. The third record will list arrests for robbery. Each record will detail the number of persons, by age, sex, and race, arrested by that agency for that offense. The number of times an agency appears in a detail file corresponds to how many different TYPES of offenses the agency reports arrests for. Consequently each record in a detail file represents an agency-offense.

DETERMINING ARREST COUNTS

The number of records listed in a detail file is NOT the number of arrests reported for that year. As stated above, each record in a detail file lists counts of arrests for a particular agency and offense. Determining total arrests is a two step process. First, it is necessary to sum across the detail categories of age, sex, and or race for each record. This gives total arrests for that agency-offense. Then, the aggregate total across all records must be calculated. This gives total arrests. An SPSS example of computing arrest counts is listed in the appendix.

LINKAGE VARIABLES

The main variable for linking header and detail files is the ORI. In addition, these variables are common to both the header and detail files:
